All courses had a CO score of above 4 and is highly appreciable and well aligned with the objectives of course outcome in Botany.



Paper III course had **45.21%** below 50% that need adequate improvisation and implementation of improved teaching pedagogies.


The teaching pedagogies suggested were as follows:

ACTION TAKEN REPORT ON THE FEED BACK ANALYSIS OF COURSE OUTCOME

The Coordinator of PG Biochemistry, Department of Biochemistry convened a meeting to discuss the students' feedback report of Course outcome (CO) of PG biochemistry.

The observations made are as follows:

No of courses had a CO score **below 3.5** and are not areas of immediate concern.

Course outcome of all I sem (BCT-101, BCT-102, BCT-103, BCT-104, BCT-105, BCP 106 and BCP-107), II sem (BCT-201, BCT-202, BCT-203, BCT-204, BCT-205, BCP 206 and BCP-207), III sem (BCT-301, BCT-302, BCT-303, BTS-307, BCT-305, and BCP 306) and IV sem (BCT-401, BCT-402, BCT-403, BCT-404, BCP-405, BCP 406) had CO score **between 3.6 and 4.0** and are areas which need to be improved.

BCT 105, BCP 205, BCP 206 BCP 305, BCP 306 and BCT 403 courses had a CO score of **above 4** and is highly appreciable.

Based on the end semester result analysis

I sem (BCT-101, BCT-102, BCT-103, BCT-104, BCT-105, BCP 106 and BCP-107), II sem (BCT-201, BCT-202, BCT-203, BCT-204, BCT-205, BCP 206 and BCP-207), III sem (BCT-301, BCT-302, BCT-303, BTS-307, BCT-305, and BCP 306) and IV sem (BCT-401, BCT-402, BCT-403, BCT-404, BCP-405, BCP 406) courses had above 80% result.

None of the course had below 50 % that need adequate improvisation and implementation of improved teaching pedagogies

The teaching pedagogies suggested were as follows:


- **Group discussions-** to help students learn faster, improve communication skills, encourage to think creatively and help in refining understanding of the material.

- **Virtual labs-** to explain complex theoretical concepts to students through a visual, immersive experience that can make it simpler for students to understand and provide synchronization needed between explaining the theoretical ideas and practical application.
- **Class quiz-** to stimulate interest in learning
- **Seminar presentations-** to improve communication skills, gain knowledge, motivation and confidence.
- **Computer Assisted Learning-** to make learning process more interactive and engaging
- **Self study topics-** to encourage self learning
- **Context base learning-** the use of real-life and fictitious examples in teaching environments in order to learn through the actual, practical experience with a subject which motivates and encourages the learners to introspect and explore their talent and learning.

- No courses had a CO score below 3.5.
- **Eight** courses(BTT-302, BTP-305A, BTP-305B, BTS-307, BTT-103, BTS-105, BTT-401, BTT-204) had a CO score of **above 4** and this was highly appreciated
- The end semester result analysis showed that:
 - Sixteen out of seventeen courses had more than 90% pass result in the odd semester
 - All courses had above 90% pass result in the even semester
- There were **no courses** with less than 50% pass result that need adequate improvisation and implementation of improved teaching pedagogies.
